

City of Worland
Buildings and Grounds Commission
Regular Meeting
March 10, 2008

The Building and Grounds Commission met on Monday, March 10, 2008 at 6:32 P.M. in the Council Chambers at City Hall. Commission Members in attendance were: Chairman Loyd Worley and Curt Christoffersen. Also in attendance were: Superintendent of Public Works Gene Cliame, Parks Maintenance Worker Mark Osbon, Clerk/Treasurer Tracy Glanz and Mike Karr with the Northern Wyoming Daily News. Councilmember Justin Pfeiffer was absent.

Under Old Business Councilmember Loyd Worley asked if there was a blueprint of the proposed new restroom and concession stand facility at Newell Sargent Park. Councilmember Worley would like the restrooms to be about the same size of those at Pioneer Square and would prefer a cement structure versus a steel building. The restroom should be cinderblock instead of sheetrock to protect against vandalism. The size of the concession stand was also discussed. Parks Maintenance Worker Mark Osbon felt the current building is big enough and doesn't need to be any bigger. Superintendent of Public Works Gene Cliame stated that the amount budgeted for this project is \$50,000.00, he will ask the Rec. Board if they can come up with \$35,000.00 to cover the total estimated cost.

Parks Maintenance Worker Mark Osbon reported that the fence is coming along and that he has been busy at the cemetery. The parks crew will start sweeping the last week in March, and then pressure up the water lines to start watering, weather permitting. The Lower Hanover Canal will be burning canal banks through town within the next couple of weeks and City personnel usually help and provide the water truck. The City water truck is out of service so we may have to rent a water truck. The Councilmembers asked Mark to make sure an ad was placed in the paper to notify residents prior to the burn.

Councilmember Worley asked if the Sanitation truck will be retired when the new truck arrives. Superintendent of Public Works Cliame said that the truck will be modified and used to haul water. Gene was asked to sell the barrel off the truck once it has been modified, if possible.

Superintendent of Public Works Cliame reported that the Airport Sewer Line project was progressing.

Clerk/Treasurer Glanz informed the Councilmembers of the proposed timeline for the budget process. Discussion followed.

There being no further discussion, the meeting adjourned at 6:48 p.m.
