

COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMISSION
May 14, 2007

The Community Services Commission of the City Council of Worland, Wyoming met in regular session at the Airport at 7:00 p.m. on May 14, 2007. Councilmembers present were Curt Christoffersen, George Hazen and Justin Pfeiffer. Also attending were Airport Manager Gary Thompson, Assistant Superintendent of Public Works Gary Gerber, Police Chief Bob Richardson, Clerk/Typist Nancy Dellos and Jileana Childs from the Northern Wyoming Daily News.

Assistant Superintendent of Public Works Gary Gerber reported that they will be repairing well three. They are also working on the irrigation line on Russell.

Councilmembers Bud Callaham, Loyd Worley, Bob Nelsen, Shane Anderson, Jerry Alexander and Vasca Gilmore joined the meeting.

Airport Manager Gary Thompson reported that he had talked with Senator Enzi's office and we received the \$1.645 million in a grant from FAA, but we haven't received the official paper work yet. Gary does have the paper work on the \$1.1 million grant from the State for the project this summer. A pre-construction meeting was held on April 26th.

Gary reported effective June 9th of this year they will be required to do a fire fighting standby for each and every flight; there will be some extra overtime involved. The specifications and contracts for the aircraft rescue and fire fighting vehicle are being worked on. Gary did get six hundred thousand dollars from the State for that.

Gary is working with local contractors to get prices to replace four doors in the terminal building going to TSA offices. The cost will be reimbursed by the Government Services Administration.

Gary discussed some of his budget concerns for the following fiscal year. Some of the cuts proposed by the finance commission are just to great to allow for a full years operations.

Police Chief Bob Richardson reported that his officers would like to have a department meeting on Tuesday May 15th regarding the 12 to 8 hour shift change. They may have to go to single coverage shifts. Discussion followed.

Councilmember Bob Nelsen would like to meet the new Police Officers that we have on the force. Police Chief Richardson said that he could arrange that when they get back from the Academy, one of the Officers will graduate in July.

Police Chief Richardson discussed more on hours and wages for his department, and suggested that longevity could be paid after four or five years of service, maybe five hundred dollars and then after ten years of service, maybe one thousand dollars.

Councilmember Christoffersen reported that he will visit with the council at the next council meeting about the situation with Community Development Director and building permits.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
