

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
OF WORLAND, WYOMING  
March 5, 2007

On the 5th day of March, 2007 the City Council of Worland, Wyoming met in regular session in the Council Chambers in City Hall at 7:00 p.m. Mayor Sonny Shearer presided and the Councilmembers in attendance were: Loyd Worley, Jerry Alexander, Bud Callaham, Vasca Gilmore, George Hazen, Bob Nelsen, Curt Christoffersen and Justin Pfeiffer. Also present were: City Attorney, Kent Richins; Police Chief, Bob Richardson and Clerk-Treasurer, Tracy Glanz. Councilmember Shane Anderson was absent.

There were four visitors present for this meeting of the City Council.

Councilmember Vasca Gilmore led the Council and visitors in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion: to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on February 20, 2007.

Vote: The motion passed unanimously.

City Attorney Kent Richins informed the Council that he had sent a letter to relatives of the owner of 1216 Charles and hoped to receive signed Warranty Deeds for the house and property. Discussion followed.

Tolly Dewey of Rock Bottom Bar and Grill requested that the local liquor establishments be allowed to stay open for 24 hours on St. Patrick's Day, March 17, 2007.

Motion: to allow the local liquor establishments to stay open for 24 hours on St. Patrick's Day.

Second by: Councilmember Christoffersen.

Vote: The motion passed unanimously.

John McMartin asked the Council if they were going to re-visit building a Community Hall. Discussion followed.

Clerk/Treasurer Tracy Glanz updated the Council on the estimated supplemental distribution from the State as determined by WAM. It looks like the distribution will be less than last year.

Police Chief Bob Richardson asked for clarification on the motion to allow payment of vacation over the maximum allowed as it affects the police department. The intent of the motion was to pay for any days lost since maximum accrual was met.
